JUDGING: Tuesday, 1:00–7:00pm (Face to Face)

All flowers and plants must be grown by the member. Plants must be grown in pots long enough to become well established before exhibiting. Pots must not exceed 10 inches. Plants are to be ornamental, clean, and free from disease and insects.

*Exhibitors will have the opportunity to re-freshen their bouquets throughout the fair, once the article has been judged.

DIVISION A - Houseplants

Class No. Premiums: \$2.00, \$1.75, \$1.50, \$1.25

1. Terrarium, covered
2. Desert Garden cactus or succulents
3. Dish Garden – 3 or more different foliage plants in one container
4. Fairy Garden
5. Aloe plant
6. Jade plant
7. Foliage house plant - name variety
8. African Violet-single crown/plant
9. Begonia – any variety
10. Geranium, 1 plant
11. Coleus, 1 plant
12. Flowering house plant not listed – name variety
13. Bulb or tuberous plant
14. Fern – name variety
15. Ivy – name variety
16. Cactus or succulent plant
17. Hanging outdoor basket
18. Outdoor planter/container, 3 or more plants - identified

BOUQUETS/ARRANGEMENTS. Appropriate sized container. No artificial or commercially grown flowers. Other foliage and accessories may be used. Floral oasis recommended for arrangements.

20. Snapdragons, 3 blooms
21. Dahlias, 3 blooms
22. Zinnias, 3 blooms
23. Asters, 3 blooms
24. Marigolds, 3 blooms
25. Daisies, 3 blooms
26. Cosmos, 3 stems
27. Bouquet of Gladiolus, 3 stems
28. Lilies, 2 stems
29. Calendulas, 3 blooms
30. Petunias, 3 stems
31. Any other annual bouquet (one flower variety named), 3 stems
32. Perennial bouquet (one flower variety named), 3 stems
33. Floral arrangement for dining room
34. Arrangement using theme (Christmas, Fair, birthday etc.)
35. Arrangement of fresh flowers in basket
36. Arrangement of all annual flowers
37. Arrangement using wild flowers

38. Arrangement using all dried materials
39. Arrangement of all perennial flowers
40. Miniature arrangement not larger than 5" x 5"
41. Identify 10 flowers on poster board no longer than 14 x 22"
42. Display (poster, scrapbook, etc.) on flower project. (Example: Starting seeds, Propagation, Your Garden Plan, etc.)

DIVISION B - Perfection of Bloom

Quality flowers displayed in adequate size container.

Class No. Premiums: \$1.75, \$1.50, \$1.25, \$1.00

1. Gladiolus, 1 spike
2. Dahlias, 1 bloom
3. Daylily, 1 stem
4. Roses, 1 stem
5. Lilies Asiatic, 1 stem
6. Sunflower – Decorative variety, 1 head, 6" stem
7. Any other perennial, 1 stem (identify species)

DIVISION C - Plant Crafts

All hanging articles must have hanger

Class No. Premiums: \$2.00, \$1.75, \$1.50, \$1.25

1. Collage of dried materials
2. Potpourri – 50% of plant material grown or collected and dried by Exhibitor. List of material on 3 x 5 card in zip lock bag
3. Arrangement of pressed flowers
4. Swag – Non-Christmas
5. Corsage or boutonniere (fresh or silk flowers) (may purchase plant materials)
6. Grapevine or straw wreath decorated with dried or silk material
7. Pine cone wreath
8. Arrangement of silk flowers
9. Garden scarecrow – not to exceed 36"
10. Christmas wreath using natural evergreens—non-natural accents permitted
11. Decorated or painted flowerpot
12. Any other creative plant craft not listed above

DIVISION D - Home Grounds Improvement

Class No. Premiums: \$2.00, \$1.75, \$1.50, \$1.25

1. Plan of flower border - include before and after pictures
2. Landscape plans - before and after, or improvements made – include pictures/plans with story of progress.
3. Mounted specimens of leaves of 10 shrubs or trees, showing top and underside of leaf, properly pressed, mounted and identified.
4. Any other exhibit not listed above
