JUDGING: Thursday after Junior Division

**Notice: All animals must be identified (ear tag or health papers, tattoo) with Department Superintendent before being unloaded. Health papers will be kept on file during the Fair in the Livestock Office and turned over to the Fair Office to maintain for a 5 year period. Failure to abide by this rule will result in immediate removal of animals from grounds and forfeiture of show rights.**

- The Wisconsin County, District & State Animal Health Rules & Regulations will be followed.
- Steers will be judged before Breed Divisions. All beef animals must be dehorned.
- All animals must be in place by 12:30pm Tuesday unless previously arranged with Superintendent.
- A Champion and Reserve Champion will be chosen in each division at the discretion of the judge.
- An Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Overall Champion will be chosen from all Champions and Reserve Champions.
- The updated Uniform Premium List allows payment of premiums on a maximum of three animals per exhibitor in all market divisions under the subsection.
- No one is allowed in the show ring except people approved by the Superintendent.
- No fans allowed behind the animals. All fans must be hung to the side of the animals pointed toward the swine barn.

### BEEF CATTLE DEFINITIONS

1. A junior calf is one born on or after January 1 of the exhibit year. The calf must be at least 4 months old at the time of exhibit.
2. A senior calf is one born between September 1 and December 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
3. A summer yearling is one born between May 1 and August 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
4. A junior yearling is one born between January 1 and April 30 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
5. A senior yearling is one born between September 1 and December 31 of the second year preceding the exhibit year.
6. A 2 year old or older cow is one born before September 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and shall have calved during the past year.

### BEEF GROUP DIVISION

1. A Beef junior get of sire shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of the same bull from junior calf, senior calf, and/or summer yearling, bull and heifer divisions, with both sexes to be represented.
2. A Beef senior get of sire shall consist of 3 animals which are the offspring of one sire. All these animals shall be 2 years of age or older. The name of sire shall be designated by the Exhibitor. The animals need not be owned by a single Exhibitor.
3. A produce of dam shall consist of 2 animals, any age and any sex which are the produce of one cow.
4. A group of 3 best female cattle shall consist of 3 animals, any age, bred and owned by the Exhibitor.

- The Washington County Draft Horse Show is open to all Wisconsin residents, however, entries from Washington County and previous exhibitors will have barn space priority. Entries received from new exhibitors will be based on space available and date received. Exhibitors enter all divisions you may want to exhibit in. You can scratch but you cannot add at the Fair.
- No ATV, utility vehicles, or golf carts allowed on the premises.
- Number of entries may be limited.
- Only two premiums per entry number.
- **There will be no additional entries after June 30<sup>th</sup> or the day of the show. Please double check all of your entries to ensure that they are all correct.**
- Scratches will be allowed.
- Jr. Drivers must be accompanied by an adult.
- Classes may be combined if there is an inadequate number of exhibitors entered.
- You cannot use the same horse in any other cart classes, except for in Junior Cart Classes
- Two Copies of negative coggins test is required for each horse. (Original must be shown; one copy to be kept in Fair Office)
- Tack stalls may be limited or unavailable depending upon the number of horses entered.
- All horses must be in place by 10:00am on Thursday.
- Draft Horses will be released at 6:00pm on Sunday evening.

**All poultry and eggs must be brought in Monday 5:00pm - 8:00pm or Tuesday 8am - NOON**

- Exhibitors must show their entry by bringing it to the judging area when the division is called.
- All individual tested poultry must have leg band identification to match PT documentation.
- Duplicate documentation for pullorum - typhoid must be presented at check-in.
- Any bird showing signs of specific disease or external parasites (mites, lice etc....) upon check-in must be immediately removed from the exhibit area.
- All poultry must be on exhibit all days of Fair.
- An exhibitor may enter no more than 20 birds, and the same bird may not be entered in both junior and open divisions.
- A fee of \$0.75 per animal must be included with entry.
- Champion ribbons given in divisions of 6 or more, or at the discretion of the judge.
- Reference the APA Standard of Perfection when making entries.
- Exhibitors are responsible for feeding, watering, and cleaning cages of poultry daily.
- Failure to follow any of the above rules may result in disqualification and/or loss of premiums.

- Rabbits and other fur bearing animals showing evidence of specific disease may not be exhibited at the Fair. If at any time any animal shows signs of disease it shall be removed immediately from the exhibit and returned to the owner.
- An exhibitor may show no more than 12 animals and the same animal may not be shown in both junior and open divisions. An exhibitor may only make one entry per class number within each division.
- No rabbit under 8 weeks old or under the minimum breed weight will be allowed to be exhibited at the Fair. Exhibitors with rabbits that can escape from cages must secure the cage(s) with small wire upon check-in.
- Rabbits must be owned and cared for prior to May 1 of exhibit year, or bred by the exhibitor. Superintendents may ask for documentation if there is a question of ownership.
- All rabbits at the fair must be weaned.
- For Sale signs may be placed on cages following the end of the small animal auction on Friday. No additional rabbits that are not entered in the show, are allowed in the barn during the Fair.
- The superintendent will decide what size cage each rabbit will be given. The only breeds that will get double cages are French Lops, Flemish Giants, Checkered Giants, Giant Chinchillas, Giant Angoras, Americans, Beverens, English Lops and Meat Pens. All cage sizes are based on barn capacity as well.
- Please notify the superintendent prior to set-up if you require a double cage for a breeder's class litter so they can plan accordingly. The superintendent has the right to further divide litters if they appear uncomfortable or fighting occurs.
- No exhibitor may touch/handle/ or remove a rabbit that is not theirs. The superintendent does have the right to handle an animal if they feel that it requires attention
- All junior exhibitors are required to do at least 2 shifts of barn sitting.
- Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering on a daily basis as well as cleaning under cages as needed. Feed, water and shavings will be provided. Limited food dishes are available for junior class exhibitors. Exhibitors should plan on bringing their own dishes/water bottles.

- Llamas will not be permitted to enter/remain at the fair unless they are in a good state of health and do not show any signs of any contagious or infectious disease. If it is deemed necessary to consult a veterinarian, the exhibitor agrees to assume financial responsibility.
- In order to participate in this show, all 4-H and FFA exhibitors must have been pre-approved from Fair superintendent or assigned adult leader prior to showing in pack class, their required llama project forms completed, signed and turned into the Superintendent by the June meeting.
- All llamas are required to remain for the duration of the fair. They may be removed after 7:00 p.m. on Sun- day.
- There will be a mandatory exhibitor meeting at time of tent fair set up Saturday prior to fair.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure their llama is well cared for and humanly treated during the fair.
- Youth Exhibitors showing animals need to have their animals watered, fed, and to have their stalls clean before 9am. If unable to be there any given morning the exhibitor will need to make arrangements to have someone else take care of your animals. Superintendent needs to be notified of the change prior to this occurring.
- Exhibitors provide their own feed and bedding.
- Stalls and tack area to be cleaned prior to departure on Sunday night. Assisting with "take down" of stalls is also encouraged.

- Youth may compete in Open Performance and Youth Performance, however, they must use a different llama.
