

DEPT. 111- JR. LLAMAS/ALPACAS
(*Note: The term “llama” refers to both Llamas and alpacas)

JUDGING: Division A, B, and C – Saturday starting at 8:00am
Division D – Saturday at 4:30pm
Animals arrive Wednesday between 7-9am

Department Rules:

- All youth must be in 3rd grade or older.
- All Llamas must be registered with the ILR or AOBA and a copy of the registration presented to the Superintendent by June 30th to be eligible to exhibit at the fair. The Superintendent may accept alternative documentation at their discretion.
- Exhibitors must be the registered owners and make entry in the exact names (owner and animal) as shown on the registration certificate or have written permission from the owner to show that animal.
- Nursing llama mothers may not be accompanied in the ring by their babies.
- No llama under the age of five months may be shown.
- Intact male Llamas over the age of 24 months are not permitted in this show.
- All Llamas are to be de-wormed 7 days prior to the start of the fair.
- Llamas will not be permitted to enter/remain at the fair unless they are in a good state of health and do not show any signs of any contagious or infectious disease. If it is deemed necessary to consult a veterinarian, the exhibitor agrees to assume financial responsibility.
- In order to participate in this show, all 4-H and FFA exhibitors must have been pre-approved from Fair Superintendent or assigned adult leader prior to showing in pack class, their required llama project forms completed, signed and turned into the Superintendent by the June meeting.
- All Llamas are required to remain for the entire duration of the fair. They may be removed after 7:00 p.m. on Sunday.
- There will be a mandatory exhibitor meeting at time of tent set-up on Saturday before the fair.
- It is the exhibitor’s responsibility to make sure their llama is well cared for and humanly treated during the fair.
- Youth Exhibitors showing animals need to have their animals watered, fed, and to have their stalls clean before 9am. If unable to be there any given morning the exhibitor will need to make arrangements to have someone else take care of their animals. Superintendent needs to be notified of the change prior to this occurring.
- Exhibitors provide their own feed and bedding.
- Stalls and tack area to be cleaned prior to departure on Sunday night. Assisting with “take down” of stalls is also encouraged.
- Youth may exhibit only one entry per youth class.
- Youth may compete in Open Performance and Youth Performance, however, they must use a different llama.
- No llama may be moved from the immediate area surrounding the tent without the expressed permission of the Superintendent. Under no circumstances are Llamas to be in the food areas or other animal areas!
- All youth exhibitors must work a minimum of (3) three hour shifts of “tent duty” which include one educational demonstration and one meet and greet session during the shift. You may be asked to do more if all barn duty time slots are not filled. Sign up available on Llama project web page.
- The Superintendent will assign llamas to stalls. The stall fee doesn’t guarantee that the llama will have a single stall. If you are sharing stalls with someone, please indicate this on your entry form. We will try to honor all stalling requests, however, it may not be possible.
- At the discretion of the Superintendent, Failure to abide by the above rules may result in disqualification and/or loss of premium(s).
- The Superintendent has the right to combine classes as needed.
- No changes to any entries after June 30th, 2021.

Class No. Premiums: \$5.00, \$4.00, \$3.00, \$2.00

1. Educational poster on any Llama related topic (recommended size 14 x 22)
2. Item of equipment made by the member and used for care or training of their Llama
3. Item of equipment (different from Class #2) made by the member and used for the care or training of their Lama.
4. Any item made from 100% Llama fiber
5. Any item made from 100% Llama fiber and different from Class #4
6. Any other Lama related exhibit not listed above

DIVISION F – Non Animal Educational Costume Exhibit

JUDGING: Monday 2:30pm - 7:00pm, Ziegler Building (Vet Science Dept.)

This division recognizes the work that it takes to create a costume for the Llama Costume class. Members will bring their costume to the judging along with one or more of the items listed below. The item(s) will be left to display in the Ziegler Building during the Fair but the costumes will go with the member to be used during the costume class competition during Fair Week.

1. An educational poster documenting the steps taken to create the costume either from scratch or from recycled costumes or materials.
2. An educational poster documenting the steps taken to train the Llama to tolerate and wear the costume
3. A scrapbook documenting the steps taken to create the costume
4. A scrapbook documenting the steps taken to train the Lama to wear the costume
